

### The ILO Turin Centre's facilities

Located in an attractive park on the banks of the River Po, the Centre's campus provides a congenial environment in which to live and study.

- It contains 21 pavilions with fully equipped modern classrooms, conference halls and meeting rooms fitted out for multilingual simultaneous interpretation, a computer laboratory, and a computerized documentation centre linked to various data banks.

The campus has 287 study/bedrooms, all with private bathrooms, telephones and cable television. It also has:

- a reception desk open 24 hours a day;

- a restaurant, a self-service canteen and a coffee lounge, all catering for international dietary needs;
- a bank;
- a travel agency;
- a laundry service;
- a post office;
- an internet point;
- a recreation room;
- facilities for outdoor and indoor sports;
- an infirmary.

Social events are regularly held both on and off campus, so that participants from different cultural backgrounds can make the most of a stimulating international environment.



# Training of Trainers: Post Disaster Needs Assessment and Disaster Recovery Framework

## About the training

Disasters hamper socio-economic development and undermine the livelihoods of households and communities. Damaged assets, production losses and diminished income are the typical consequences of a disaster and affect disproportionately the poor and most vulnerable. In the aftermath of a disaster, the United Nations Development Group (UNDG), the World Bank (WB) and the European Union (EU) offer support to governments in affected countries to undertake a Post-Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA) and to develop a Disaster Recovery Framework (DRF). The three partners also engage in strengthening the capacities of governments and regional inter-governmental organisations in selected disaster-prone countries/regions to conduct PDNAs and develop DRFs. A pool of trainers has also been established to support these capacity building efforts and in order to expand the current pool of trainers, a PDNA and DRF Training of Trainers (ToT) will be organised by the UNDG, WB and EU and in collaboration with the International Training Centre of the ILO (ITC-ILO). The training targets disaster risk reduction and recovery practitioners who have an interest in becoming accredited PDNA and DRF trainers and in supporting future PDNA and DRF trainings and in-country exercises.

The ToT will be delivered by PDNA and DRF experts from the UNDG, WB and EU as well as by training and capacity building specialists of the ITC-ILO.

## Outcomes

The five-day PDNA & DRF ToT will provide participants with:

- An opportunity to acquire and/or refresh technical knowledge on the PDNA and DRF tools.
- An in-depth methodological training to enhance their training design and facilitation skills.
- The possibility to become an accredited PDNA & DRF trainer and to be included as a PDNA & DRF Expert in the global roster.

## Accreditation scheme

Participants who take part in the PDNA & DRF ToT will receive a certificate of attendance. After having successfully completed a post-ToT online assignment and supported the delivery of a PDNA & DRF training at country level, participants will be accredited as PDNA & DRF trainers and included in the Expert roster.

## Who should apply?

Experienced disaster risk reduction and recovery practitioners who are interested in becoming

accredited PDNA & DRF trainers are invited to apply for the PDNA & DRF ToT. Prospective applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Proven experience in the conduct of assessments and/or in the implementation of disaster risk reduction and/or recovery programmes at country level;
- Record of delivering technical trainings and capacity building activities to governments, international organisations, private sector and civil society;
- Binding commitment to support as a future trainer at least one PDNA & DRF training event and the conduct of a PDNA and/or development of a DRF, in the period 2017-2020;
- University degree in social sciences, development studies, or other discipline relevant to development and disaster risk reduction and recovery
- Fluency in English (written and oral) is required. Knowledge of an additional language such as French, Spanish, Portuguese and/or Russian will be considered as an advantage.

## Selection of the participants

The PDNA & DRF ToT selection committee will consider each application on a case-by-case basis. Short-listed candidates will have to pass

a short knowledge test to demonstrate their knowledge of the PDNA methodology and the DRF process in order to qualify for admission to the ToT.
