WHAT TOPICS DOES THIS COURSE COVER?

This week-long course includes preliminary exercises and reading materials, followed by practical training on campus.

- Rationale for and main concepts of lifelong career guidance in **different regions** of the world
- Career guidance as a **tool** for dealing with challenges on job matching, unemployment, skills shortages, and school dropout
- **Methods** such as information services, advice, interviews, self-assessments, and tests

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

Participants learn about career guidance for employment services, TVET centres and other educational institutions

- How to **expand access** to career guidance through career education, self-help facilities, and career information centres
- All about **career guidance models**, including curriculum-based, individual, and specialist models
- **Case studies** of national career guidance systems, as well as print- and web-based career information materials

WHAT WILL I BE ABLE TO DO?

The goal of the course is to enable participants to design new and better career guidance policies and services.

- Assess the need for career guidance at the national and regional levels and select **appropriate models**
- Shape career guidance services according to **cultural and social realities**
- Prepare training for staff and practitioners based on **international standards**


