 one discipline of Development Cooperation management.
- Combat change fatigue: the post pandemic era continues to request agility and adaptability. Not all of us find this and easy world to live in. How can we remain resilient and adaptable?
- **Peer Exchange:** Engage in meaningful dialogue with fellow practitioners from all over the world looking for new ways to a just transition and social justice.

HOW DOES THE ACADEMY WORK?

A MIX OF CONFERENCE FORMAT AND CERTIFICATION COURSE

Inspired by the success of the 2023 DC Academy, ITCILO comes back with the same innovative format, blending elements of a conference and certification courses. Participants choose one specific discipline for certification, which they study both online and in person during the Academy's duration. The programme features an on-campus event where each day includes a plenary session. These sessions, focusing on Social Justice and Just Transition, involve panel discussions that bring together participants from all certification disciplines, fostering a rich exchange of ideas and perspectives.

WHO PARTICIPATES?

We welcome a diverse group of participants, including development practitioners, project managers, evaluators, professionals from multilateral organizations, government officials, and freelancers in the field of development cooperation.



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WHAT TOPICS WILL YOU LEARN ABOUT?

BLENDED CERTIFICATION PROGRAMME IN ONE DISCIPLINE

The Academy offers a blended Certification Programme in five key disciplines of development management. Successful completion of the online phase, in-person track, and a tutor-led practicum grants a recognized certificate of achievement. The disciplines are:

- Programme and Project Design: Design strategies and plans for impactful initiatives.
- **Effective Project Management**: Leverage the principles of sound, agile and adaptive project management to ensure project success.
- Monitoring and Evaluation: Understand and apply key methods to assess programme performance.
- **Financial Management**: Gain insights into fiscal planning and oversight in development projects.
- Impact Evaluation: Measure the social and economic influence of your initiatives.

GLOBAL PRACTITIONER FORUM

In the Global Practitioner Forum plenaries, we will explore how DC can enhance social justice and facilitate a Just Transition.

- **Social Justice:** What is Social Justice and how can we capture its multifaceted nature? What is its significance to different stakeholders and its role as a unifying topic? We will examine the complexities of delivering on the global accelerator, encompassing investment, skilling, social protection, private sector development, social dialogue, and strong institutions.
- **Just Transition:** The theme of Just Transition challenges us to define a future vision beyond the Agenda 2030 SDGs. What is the ecological transitions leading us? We delve into how environmental considerations can be integrated into project management, from project and safeguard design to evaluation.
- Equal Rights and Freedom from Violence: We confront persistent issues such as women's rights, sexual exploitation and abuse, and disability rights, observing how they re-emerge in new contexts. What makes the issues so complicated? How can projects pick up the problems when they are lost out of sight?
- Partnerships: Our focus on partnerships includes a review of global trends, new financing models, and cooperative strategies. We reflect on the historical evolution of bilateral and multilateral cooperation, seeking lessons for contemporary practices. Assessing the challenges and opportunities in fostering effective partnerships.
- **Adapting to Constant Change:** We discuss strategies for managing the unceasing tide of change, acknowledging the absence of a definitive endpoint in this journey.

CROSS-DISCIPLINE EXCHANGE AND DIALOGUE

The Academy Forum will be an occasion for practitioners from various disciplines to interact. We will facilitate the interaction between project designers, managers, financial managers, monitoring specialists and evaluators with a view to enhancing project impact and sustainability.

METHODOLOGY

The Academy offers a blend of online and in-person learning, structured into three distinct phases:

- Online Distance Learning (17 June 5 July 2024): Kickstart your journey on the ITCILO eCampus with both live and self-paced preparatory activities. These will be concentrated on your chosen certification programme and the critical topics of the global practitioner forum.
- 2. One-Week On-Campus Academy (8 July 12 July 2024): Move to the next level with in-person learning at the ITCILO Campus in Turin. Participate in face-to-face workshops and join discussions on the future of development cooperation at our forum. Nestled in a 10-hectare green expanse by the Po river and at the foot of the Turin hills, our campus provides a conducive environment for immersive learning and professional growth.

Every day, one 90-minute session will be devoted to the Global Practitioner Forum, focusing on topics of critical significance. All participants will attend these insightful sessions, equipping them with strategic perspectives on the future of work in Development Cooperation.

Participants will attend three sessions, or 4.5 hours of learning on their specialized learning tracks tailored to their chosen discipline. The focused sessions of these disciplines are designed to develop or cultivate operational skills and competencies, empowering participants with practical tools and technique to perform development cooperation work better.

3. Post-Academy Online Phase (15 July – 9 August 2024): Conclude your learning journey with the presentation of your final project, integrating concepts learned from your chosen track and insights from our forum discussions on the future of development cooperation work. This online phase is designed to maximize your learning retention and provide an opportunity to showcase your proficiency.

CERTIFICATION

Upon successful completion of the three stages of the programme, participants will be awarded a Certificate of Achievement to recognize their proficiency in their chosen course.

PROJECT DESIGN CERTIFICATION PROGRAMME

INTRODUCTION TO THE COURSE

The Project Design Certification Programme enhances participants' knowledge and skills in designing and writing project proposals, overseeing such processes. It also aims to improve participants' ability to identify and leverage opportunities to mobilize financial resources for projects. By sponsoring participants in this certification programme, and thereby professionalizing and certifying their staff, organizations will strengthen their institutional capacity to design and fund successful projects.

WHO ATTENDS THIS COURSE?

Technical specialists; national project coordinators; project managers and assistants; staff of international organizations; national development planning officials; NGO officials involved in the development of project proposals and resource mobilization activities.

WHY A PROJECT DESIGN CERTIFICATION PROGRAMME?

Organizations require their employees to develop and implement projects in their respective areas of specialization. These professionals are often highly specialized in their technical field, but lack the skills needed to design well-structured and complete projects.

INTRODUCTION TO THE COURSE

Over the past decade, development cooperation practitioners have recognized and agreed on the shortcomings of the classic and rigid "waterfall" approach to project management. This is particularly true for institutional capacity-development projects, awareness-raising projects and those implemented in fragile contexts. Recent research on complex social systems and ways of addressing non-linear cause-and-effect relationships points in the same direction. The behaviour of the actors involved is unpredictable, making it essential to adopt an agile, tailor-made approach to project management. For those who need to specialize in project management in complex

contexts, the ITCILO offers an online certification programme to enable them to acquire all the knowledge, technical skills and tools necessary to ensure agile, adaptive and effective project implementation, taking into account the complexity of the social systems in which such projects take place.

WHO ATTENDS THIS COURSE?

The course is designed for project directors, project implementation staff and chief technical advisors (CTAs) of projects funded by international financial institutions (IFIs) or implemented through international organizations; development practitioners working in programmes and projects. Candidates are expected to be currently involved in the management or supervision of such projects. Previous knowledge or work experience in project management is an advantage.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

- A body of knowledge on theories of and approaches used to manage projects in contexts of uncertainty and in complex social systems
- Parameters for deciding how to organize project management (agile, hybrid or predictive models) tailored to the project context and its stakeholders to ensure effective project management

- Soft skills for engaging the project team and managing stakeholder expectations and contributions
- Communication strategies to foster collaboration between project stakeholders, facilitate remote working, increase project visibility and report on results



FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT FOR DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

INTRODUCTION TO THE COURSE

Financial management of development projects is more than an administrative and control function. Sound financial management is a critical prerequisite for successful project implementation. Timely and accurate financial information is essential for effective decision-making, as well as for corrective action by project management to improve the prospects of timely completion within the planned project budget and scope of deliverables. Sound project financial management provides the essential information needed by those who manage, implement and monitor projects, including government oversight agencies and financing institutions. It also provides assurance

to recipient countries, lenders and the donor community that funds have been used efficiently and for the intended purpose, and acts as a deterrent to fraud and corruption by providing internal controls and the ability to quickly identify unusual occurrences and variances. By acquiring the skills needed to set up the various components of an integrated project financial management system, with appropriate modules/procedures for planning and budgeting, accounting, financial reporting, internal control, audit, procurement and disbursement, you will be able to position yourself as a certified and credible project financial officer.

WHO ATTENDS THIS COURSE?

Financial officers and assistants; project finance officers; administrative and financial assistants; senior project assistants; disbursement specialists; project accountants and assistants; financial management specialists; accounts managers.

WHY A FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT COURSE?

Good project financial management is essential if development cooperation projects are to achieve their objectives. Well planned, organised and executed project financial management also builds confidence by demonstrating to stakeholders that adequate governance arrangements are in place.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

- Understand the fundamental definitions, concepts, boundaries, implications and standards of project financial management
- Prepare and present the project budget in accordance with the agreed accounting system(s) and identify key stakeholders involved in project financial management.

- Operate the project financial system: managing stakeholders, collecting and using financial data, managing budget changes, fiduciary risks and financial controls.
- Develop a bespoke project financial management system, identify computerized solutions and systems, and develop a project operations manual.
- Apply soft skills and knowledge to understand and manage project-related financial challenges, contingencies and issues
- Adopt a lifelong learning paradigm for project financial management

Participants will be able to competently design and operate project financial management systems and make corresponding payments/disbursements in accordance with sound professional standards and the harmonized requirements of donors and their respective governments.

- Capture financial parameters in core project documents to the design the financial management system

This comprehensive course brings together evaluation experts and researchers, and development practitioners, in a collaborative and instructive learning space. Participants will gain valuable experience in impact evaluations and cost-benefit analysis, enabling smarter decision-making for organizations and policy makers. This programme is highly recommended for anyone interested in advancing their skills in impact evaluations and becoming a certified expert in the field.

Comprising more than 280 private dormitories, the Turin Campus provides a broad range of services for course participants and partners including a free-flow restaurant, travel agency, laundromat, post office, gym, medical services and a reception desk open 24/7.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND DIVERSITY

Participants can enjoy social events organized by the Turin Centre as well as by their course facilitators. Whether on or off campus, people from different cultural backgrounds have the opportunity to listen to live music together, cook and share traditional foods, or team up to play games and network.

WITHDRAWAL, CANCELLATION POLICY, AND REFUNDS FOR OPEN COURSES

If an enrolled participant wishes or must withdraw from a course, they may choose to apply to a different course or be substituted by another candidate. The participant must notify the Centre, in writing, of their decision at least 14 days prior to the start date of the course. Cancellation of participation in regular courses will result in the following penalties:

- 14 days or more prior to the start date of the course: No penalty, 100% refund of amount paid less applicable bank charges
- 8 to 13 days prior to the start date of the course: Penalty of 50% of course price, refund of residual amount paid (if any) less applicable bank charges
- 7 days or less prior to the start date of the course: Penalty of 100% of course price.
