Anecdote of my ITCILO and OSH World-Class Journey

It's been over two years since the ITCILO experience and completing the M.Sc. Course in Occupational Health and Safety (M.Sc. OSH) has proven to be the best career development step I could have taken after twelve years of corporate HSE service. Forgive me if I do not go into the financial struggles of a self-funded student from a low-income nation...

...The industry-tailored lessons, the weekly field trips and industry visits, and the well-knitted case studies are second to none in the world of OSH training. I may be wrong to say my experience was unique, but let me share:

At the end of the on-campus phase in March 2023, I was awarded a part-scholarship by the ITCILO to return to Turin in April 2023 and take part in the "Workshop for the Management of OSH for international organizations of the United Nations", after which I dived into my dissertation on Designing OSH Management Systems for Healthcare Institutions. These two opportunities sandwiched my ITCILO experience in Turin and have proven to be the icing on the cake on my dream OSH Career.

During a feedback session in one of the lectures at the ITCILO, I was asked what impact I hoped my training at the ITCILO would have, and I replied that I wanted to become a leading voice in OSH in Africa and a key player in policy formulation and implementation.

Zoom to life after the M.Sc. OSH - Only the second year, I already feel that I live that dream OSH. In only the second year, I feel that I am already living that dream:

I currently serve as The UNICEF National Project Consultant for the Design of the National Practical Guide and Policy for Hazards and Risk Mitigation for Hospitals in Cameroon via effective and sustainable healthcare waste management.

My work with UNICEF and the Ministry of Public Health in Cameroon has culminated in a legal instrument for the mitigation of risks emanating from hospital wastes in Cameroon - "The National Policy and Guide for HealthCare Waste Management in Cameroon".

I serve as the General Secretary of the Consortium for OSH professionals in Africa (OSHAFRICA), a platform for research and advocacy on OSH policymaking in Africa.

I lead an OSH consultancy firm in Cameroon – OSH-Labb Consulting – shaping corporate OSH and ESG policies and enhancing compliance therewith; and serving as HSE/ESG Programmes Advisor for two local CSOs on the promotion of decent work, through research, training and advocacy in Cameroon, through which I have the exceptional privilege of hosting the annual OSH Conference for the South-West Region of Cameroon, culminating in the celebration of World OSH Day every April 28th.

I support research and training at two universities in Cameroon by developing and delivering tailor-made courses in OSH for healthcare, for engineers, for business leaders and for the BSc Programme in OSH.

My advice to current and future students for the M.Sc. OSH at the ITCILO in Turin is:

Pay close attention to the practical orientations from industry experts. Those are the ingredients needed for designing relevant industry OSH solutions anywhere in the world. Focus on them, align with your dreams, brave the tough schedules, and you will be set for world-class OSH impact and roles.

I am Juna Mathema from Kathmandu Nepal and I participated in the Labour Migration Academy in July 2024.

The course introduced me to global issues and best migration governance practices on labour migration. I had planned to apply what I have learnt in this course and share my knowledge with stakeholders in Nepal. The activity on developing labour migration policy proved to be most important to me. I was one of the five-member team that drafted Nepal's National Labour Policy under the Ministry of Labour, Employment and Social Security.

As a private sector representative my contribution to the policy was largely focused on reintegration of labour migrants. The learnings from the course, the practical exercise specially under the guidance of Mr. Vincent Williams proved to be most valuable to me as I was able to bring in components of coherence, coordination and cooperation while drafting the policy. Additionally, I also provided support in drafting reintegration guidelines for private sector for the private sector for the Nepalese Chamber of Commerce and Industry (FNCCI).

My fellow participants were from around the world and more from South Asian counties. Understanding the labour migration challenges of other countries and how they work towards overcoming the hurdles helped me generate my own ideas for improvement in my country. However, the friendship we shared went beyond just learning about the countries' migrant issues. We bonded really well and have an active WhatsApp group where we are still sharing conversations.

Even with the studies that I have done so far, the issues surrounding labour migrants are very vast and the learning from the course has helped me to widen my perspective and make better changes for them. Remittances have become a major portion of our GDP and I strongly believe that the migrant population deserves due respect. The knowledge that I gained from the course and my interactions with fellow participants has helped me adopt better approaches to facilitate and support the labour migrants through policy and programmes.

I participated in an online training course on "Strengthening the Role of Workers Organizations in the Promotion of Adequate and Effective Social Protection for All" in 2022 and, in the same year, in a "Trade Union e-learning course on the UNSDCF and the Decent Work Agenda".

The above-mentioned courses, which are of another level, have greatly contributed to my career as trade unionist. Thanks to the ITCILO, I am able to:

- 1. Use ILS, ILO tools and other instruments to engage, advocate and formulate key demands for adequate, inclusive and demand-driven social protection floors;
- 2. Develop trade union strategies in the context of emerging social protection challenges, workers' realities, decent work and future work;
- 3. Articulate entry points for trade union mobilising, advocacy and engagement based on the ongoing government, ILO, other UN agencies and multilateral development institutions social protection programmes in Africa;
- 4. Articulate the weaknesses in social protection policies and regulations and, proffer solutions through social dialogue on alternative and innovative financing mechanisms in order to address the deficits and promote broad-based social protection floors;
- 5. Share, learn from and, replicate successful national and sectoral trade union collective bargaining initiatives on social protection;
- Develop priority trade union actions and strategies on effective and meaningful social protection floors, especially in the context of social security reforms and workers in vulnerable situations including women, youths and, workers with disabilities;
- 7. Expand and strengthen the ITUS-Africa Social Protection Network to be knowledgeable on social protection for effective delivery at national level.

It's worth mentioning that, following the general election held in Mauritius on 10th November 2024, the leader of Resistence et Alternative, Mr. Ashok Subron, a trade unionist, was elected and is serving the country as Minister of Social Integration, Social Security and National Solidarity. After achieving the minimum wage in Mauritius, we are now working for a decent living wage to provide adequate coverage for basic necessities such as food, shelter, child services and health care. With the support of Mr. Ashok Subron we firmly believe that our target will be achieved.
