The 19th and 20th ICLS resolutions on work statistics are crucial for the analysis of decent work related SDG indicators, particularly SDG 8 on promoting inclusive and sustainable growth, employment and decent work for all. A strong statistical system for producing, collecting and disseminating reliable, comprehensive and timely labour market information is critical for evidence-based policy making which promotes "full and productive employment and decent work for all". The ILO Department of Statistics in close collaboration with the International Training Centre of the ILO are proud to offer the 2019 Labour Market Statistics and Analysis Academy with a particular focus on the outcomes of the 19th and 20th ICLS concerning the emerging trends in the world of work, and the SDG monitoring framework to measure decent work

HOW & WHAT

HOW DOES IT WORK?

This academy prepares national and international stakeholders to use the new SDG statistical monitoring system. It is organized into two separate, yet related, "learning paths."

• Learning Path 1:

This path is designed for officials involved in SDG indicator monitoring and reporting at local, national, and international levels, as well as labour market and development analysts.

• Learning Path 2:

This path is made for labour statistics practitioners, including managers and technical staff, from national statistical offices, ministries of labour, and related institutions.

WHAT ARE THE TOPICS?

The academy includes plenary sessions, discussions of key concepts, and studies of best practices relevant to both learning paths.

- **Key international statistical standards,** including the 20th ICLS resolution on statistics on work relationships and the 19th ICLS resolution on work statistics
- SDG Global Indicator Framework
- Gender mainstreaming in labour statistics and relevant SDG indicators
- Good practices in labour market information systems and SDG monitoring strategies

HOW WILL I LEARN?

Participants of the academy will enhance their technical capacities and skills to identify, collect, analyze, and disseminate labour market information and other indicators related to decent work

- Plenary sessions allow participants to share knowledge relevant across learning paths
- Specific sessions facilitate more intensive learning on key topics within learning paths
- Panel discussions and group exercises provide opportunities to practice and collaborate

- Labour statisticians from national statistical offices, ministries of labour, and other government institutions responsible for SDG statistical monitoring
- Employment and development policy analysts from national statistical offices, labour ministries and other government institutions, research and academic institutions, international organizations, and donor organizations
- **Officials** responsible for managing the production and dissemination of labour market statistics, particularly for national SDG reporting
- Social partners: Employers' and workers' organization.

HOW TO APPLY

Admission is competitive and space is limited. Interested candidates should go to bit.ly/2Mf5NmP to apply before 11 October 2019.

Women and people with disabilities are highly encouraged to apply.

Participants are evaluated on the following mandatory criteria:

- Work experience in relevant field
- An official sponsorship letter issued by their organization (or a donor organization), stating that it will cover:
 - The cost of the Academy of €3,735 (includes Tuition and Subsistence fees); (in case of applying for a fellowship, please indicate the remaining amount);
 - The cost of the international travel between the country of origin and the Turin Centre.

PRICE

Tuition: €2,335 • Subsistence: €1,400 • Total: €3,735

Tuition covers the cost of programme development and management, secretarial and administrative support costs, the use of training facilities and teaching equipment, office supplies and training materials, and emergency medical insurance.

Subsistence covers lodging and meals on campus.

A limited number of **partial scholarships** are available. Candidates that strongly fulfill the selection criteria receive priority.


