OVERVIEW

SNAPSHOT OF THE COURSE

Worldwide, TB is one of the top 10 causes of death and the leading cause from a single infectious agent (above HIV/AIDS). Millions of people continue to fall sick with TB each year. The ENGAGE-TB approach seeks to shift the global perspective of TB from only a medical illness to a more comprehensive socioeconomic and community problem. The purpose of this three-days training is to provide participants the opportunity to

implementing and scaling-up integrated community-based TB prevention, diagnosis, treatment and care using the ENGAGE-TB approach.

WHAT

WHAT TOPICS DOES THIS COURSE COVER?

Through a highly participatory format, participants will have the opportunity to experience the ENGAGE-TB approach, addressing the six areas that facilitate the engagement of NGOs and other CSOs in community-based TB activities:

- Situation analysis
- Enabling environment
- Guidelines and tools
- Task identification
- Monitoring and evaluation
- Capacity building

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

Participants learn how to:

- Define the ENGAGE-TB approach and identify the six areas of implementation;
- Identify soft skills that are required for an effective implementation of the ENGAGE-TB;
- Carry out a situation analysis through choosing information and making a plan;
- Describe and contextualize appropriate ethical behaviors;
- Collaborate to prepare guidelines for the implementation of community-based TB activities;
- Identify challenges and define solutions through performing SWOT analysis;
- Be familiar with monitoring and evaluation indicators for community-based TB activities.

WHAT WILL I BE ABLE TO DO?

Through an extended role-play, participants are confronted with realistic scenarios and the point of view of different stakeholders involved in the process (NGOs and CSOs). The whole training will enable participants to:

- Effectively communicate and collaborate with relevant stakeholders;
- Explore practical solutions for integrating TB into community- health programmes;
- Identify challenges and define community-based activities that are scalable.

WHY

WHY SHOULD I JOIN?

This training combines a high spectrum of learning approaches, tools and methods that participants will experience and contextualize at each stage of the ENGAGE-TB approach.

- Each participant will be treated as an individual, with their specific background, values and challenges to overcome.
- Similarly, each participant will be regarded as a valuable contributor, with a unique perspective, experience and stories to share.
