WHAT TOPICS DOES THE COURSE COVER?

- The Integrated Strategy on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work: Understanding the ILO's approach to promoting core labour rights and integrating them into national and organizational strategies.
- Definitions, indicators, and forms of forced labour according to international labour standards.
- International labour standards, with a focus on ILO Conventions No. 29, 105, and the Protocol of 2014.
- Legal and institutional frameworks to prevent and address forced labour.
- The socio-economic root causes of forced labour and strategies to tackle them.
- Examining the responsibility of businesses and organizations to prevent forced labour within their supply chains.
- Tools and methods for identification, prevention, and remediation of forced labour.
- Integrating forced labour prevention across policies and development programs.
- Effective roles of governments, employers, workers' organizations, civil society, and other actors.
- Survivor-centred approaches: protection, access to justice, and reintegration.
- Advocacy and influencing skills to promote systemic change.

HOW IS THE COURSE ORGANIZED?

- Approximately 36 hours of learning.
- Online preliminary readings, video presentations, and resources.
- Residential week: 5-day interactive sessions at the ITCILO in Turin
- Knowledge assessment at the start and at the end of the training.
- Successful completion of the knowledge assessments and a final assignment will result in a Certificate of Participation.

WITHDRAWAL, CANCELLATION POLICY, AND REFUNDS FOR OPEN COURSES

If an enrolled participant wishes or must withdraw from a course, they may choose to apply to a different course or be substituted by another candidate. The participant must notify the Centre, in writing, of their decision at least 14 days prior to the start date of the course. Cancellation of participation in regular courses will result in the following penalties:

- 14 days or more prior to the start date of the course: No penalty, 100% refund of amount paid less applicable bank charges
- 8 to 13 days prior to the start date of the course: Penalty of 50% of course price, refund of residual amount paid (if any) less applicable bank charges
- 7 days or less prior to the start date of the course: Penalty of 100% of course price.
