Gender equality remains a cornerstone of social justice, sustainable development, and decent work. Yet, across the globe, **progress is encountering intensified resistance**. Political and cultural backlash is actively contesting the foundations of women's rights. These dynamics are not without consequence—they hinder efforts to close gender gaps in employment, limit access to leadership roles, and slow progress toward inclusive workplaces. At the same time, global disruptions such as economic crises, climate change, digital transformation, and armed conflict are deepening existing inequalities. Women and underrepresented groups often face greater risks of job insecurity, lower-quality employment, and exclusion from emerging sectors of the economy.

The **Gender Academy** emerges at a critical moment—one that demands renewed commitment, intersectional thinking, and collective resilience. This edition of the Academy invites participants to reflect deeply on where we stand, what is at risk, and how to move forward strategically to advance gender equality in the world of work.

Hosted by the **International Training Centre of the ILO (ITCILO)**, the Gender Academy is a unique global learning space that brings together a vibrant community of gender equality advocates, policy actors, and practitioners.

Over the course of **two weeks**, participants will engage with cutting-edge tools, peer learning, and practical strategies to respond to today's challenges and co-create a more inclusive and equitable future of work.

WHAT

WHAT WILL YOU EXPLORE AT THE GENDER ACADEMY?

With gender equality under pressure, persistent structural inequalities and hard-won progress at risk of reversal, the Gender Academy 2025 provides a global platform to unpack challenges, share strategies, and co-create solutions for a more inclusive and just world of work.

You will engage with a rich mix of **high-level plenaries**, **interactive panels**, **creative labs**, **and elective workshops**, all designed to connect global debates with practical tools and community-building.

Plenary Sessions

Plenary sessions will guide participants through key issues defining the current gender equality agenda. These include women's labour market participation, pay equity, the care economy, violence and harassment in the world of work, the implications of AI and digital technologies, intersectionality and inclusion in the workplace, among other.

Thematic Tracks & Electives

Participants will tailor their learning journey by selecting from **five thematic tracks**, each focused on a key dimension of gender equality in the world of work. These tracks are designed to provide coherence, depth, and flexibility—allowing participants to explore critical issues such as inclusive leadership, workplace rights, care systems, digital transformation, and policy reform.

Each track includes two linked **elective courses**—one offered in Week 1 and one in Week 2. Participants can choose to follow a single track across both weeks for deeper specialization, or select electives from two different tracks to broaden their perspective. In total, each participant will attend two elective courses, building practical skills, engaging in peer learning, and strengthening their capacity to create change in their own contexts.

Here are the five tracks you can choose from:

Track 1: Building Alliances for Change

Strengthen collective action by engaging diverse actors and amplifying voices to advance gender equality. Learn how to build strategic alliances, shape compelling narratives, and foster inclusive allyship that drives lasting change.

- Elective Week 1: Advocating for Change: Building Evidence, Narratives and Alliances
- Elective Week 2: Men Standing for Equality: Strategies for Inclusive Allyship

Track 2: Strategies that Work: Tools to Advance Equality

Equip yourself with practical methods to promote gender equality across institutional, workplace and community contexts.

- Elective Week 1: The Art of Gender Training: Pedagogy, Participation and Practice
- Elective Week 2: Making Pay Equity a Reality: Tools for Gender-Neutral Job Evaluation and Policy Change

Track 3: Equity in Action: Creating Safe and Inclusive Work Environments

Move beyond policy to transform how workplaces function in practice. Learn how to identify and address the roots of inequality, tackle violence and harassment, and promote fairness, safety, and dignity for all.

- Elective Week 1: Diversity, Equity and Inclusion in Action: Tackling Intersectional Discrimination
- Elective Week 2: Ending Violence and Harassment in the World of Work

Track 4: Emerging Frontiers: Gender Equality in a Changing World

Navigate the future of work by addressing digital transformation and care systems with a gender-responsive lens.

- Elective Week 1: Work, Gender and Algorithms: Confronting Bias in the Age of AI
- Elective Week 2: Decent Work and the Care Economy: Designing Inclusive Policies and Investments

Track 5: Mainstreaming Gender Everywhere

From organizations to climate policies, explore how to integrate gender equality across programmes and systems.

- Elective Week 1: Gender Mainstreaming in the UN System and Large Organizations
- Elective Week 2: Gender-Responsive Strategies in Climate Action

WITHDRAWAL, CANCELLATION POLICY, AND REFUNDS FOR OPEN COURSES

If an enrolled participant wishes or must withdraw from a course, they may choose to apply to a different course or be substituted by another candidate. The participant must notify the Centre, in writing, of their decision at least 14 days prior to the start date of the course. Cancellation of participation in regular courses will result in the following penalties:

- 14 days or more prior to the start date of the course: No penalty, 100% refund of amount paid less applicable bank charges
- 8 to 13 days prior to the start date of the course: Penalty of 50% of course price, refund of residual amount paid (if any) less applicable bank charges
- 7 days or less prior to the start date of the course: Penalty of 100% of course price.
