The course is built around the interaction between social security, occupational safety and labour inspection. Participants will have an opportunity to explore practical issues surrounding the preparation, conduction, and follow-up of inspection visits as well as accident investigations. This training activity also embraces the human rights approach to social security and protection against certain life risks and social needs.

WHAT TOPICS DOES THIS COURSE COVER?

- Principles, functions and main characteristics of social security inspection
- Interaction between social security, occupational safety and labour inspection
- ILO Guidelines on general principles of labour inspection

- Describe the principles, functions and main characteristics of labour inspection;
- Strengthen the capacity of labour inspectors in fulfilling their role monitoring compliance with social security regulations;
- Apply the key principles in the preparation, conduction, and follow-up of an inspection visit;
- Explore interaction between social security, occupational safety and labour inspection;
- Familiarize themselves with the best practices of social security inspection in selected countries.

The course consists of 60 learning hours with a residential format at the ITCILO campus in Turin over 5 days;

Pre-course and post-course activities intend to facilitate individual learning and practical application of knowledge.

WITHDRAWAL, CANCELLATION POLICY, AND REFUNDS FOR OPEN COURSES

If an enrolled participant wishes or must withdraw from a course, they may choose to apply to a different course or be substituted by another candidate. The participant must notify the Centre, in writing, of their decision at least 14 days prior to the start date of the course. Cancellation of participation in regular courses will result in the following penalties:

- 14 days or more prior to the start date of the course: No penalty, 100% refund of amount paid less applicable bank charges
- 8 to 13 days prior to the start date of the course: Penalty of 50% of course price, refund of residual amount paid (if any) less applicable bank charges
- 7 days or less prior to the start date of the course: Penalty of 100% of course price.
