WHO

WHO ATTENDS THIS EVENT?

Seafarers' and shipowners' representatives; officials from Ministries of Labour, Ministries of Transport and other relevant maritime competent and regulatory authorities, maritime inspectors, ships' officers and ships operators; officials from UN agencies and EU responsible for maritime related programmes.

WHAT WILL I GAIN FROM THE EVENT?

More specifically, the three-day Global Forum will be an opportunity to update knowledge and to facilitate a better understanding on key issues arising in the context of the COVID-19:

- Taking stock of the 2014, 2016 and 2018 Amendments implementing challenges;
- Assessing the evolving situation of specific issues affecting seafarers and shipowners worldwide due to the impact of COVID-19: Crew change; Seafarers' welfare (physical and mental health, short leave), access to internet connectivity;
- Enforcing MLC, 2006: good practices and challenges (role of Port State control; role of Committee of Experts; role of ITF Inspectors).

HOW

HOW IS THE EVENT ORGANIZED?

The e-learning programme will be interactive and participatory and will be structured as follows:

- **Plenary sessions** (tentatively from 13.00 to 14.00 CET) on key topics with the involvement of international experts;
- **Group works** including interactive discussions on case studies, facilitated by e-coaches, followed by presentation of key findings (schedule will be arranged according to the time-zone of each geographic group);
- **Wrap up** (30 minutes).

REQUIREMENTS FOR A PROFITABLE PARTICIPATION

The event is offered in English through the ZOOM platform.

A good command of the working language is required as well as a good internet connection.

CERTIFICATION

On completion of the Global Forum, participants will receive a certificate of attendance issued by the International Training Centre of the ILO.

HOW MUCH DOES THIS EVENT COST?

The tuition fee is **450 Euros**. It includes: event preparation, implementation and evaluation; access to the dedicated E-Campus and online resources.

WITHDRAWAL, CANCELLATION POLICY, AND REFUNDS FOR OPEN COURSES

If an enrolled participant wishes or must withdraw from a course, they may choose to apply to a different course or be substituted by another candidate. The participant must notify the Centre, in writing, of their decision at least 14 days prior to the start date of the course. Cancellation of participation in regular courses will result in the following penalties:

- 14 days or more prior to the start date of the course: No penalty, 100% refund of amount paid less applicable bank charges
- 8 to 13 days prior to the start date of the course: Penalty of 50% of course price, refund of residual amount paid (if any) less applicable bank charges
- 7 days or less prior to the start date of the course: Penalty of 100% of course price.
