WHAT TOPICS DOES THE COURSE COVER?

This course explores how MNEs can contribute to economic and social progress and the realization of decent work for all.

- The **contribution of business** to the realization of the Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work
- Inclusive, responsible and sustainable **business practices**
- The role of **social dialogue and industrial relations**
- **Working conditions, employment promotion and training.**
