#### SNAPSHOT OF THE COURSE

It provides a comprehensive introduction the ILO Tripartite Declaration of Principles concerning Multinational Enterprises and Social Policy (MNE Declaration): the ILO's tool providing guidance to enterprises, governments, employers' and workers' organizations on inclusive, responsible and sustainable business practices.

This course explores how MNEs can contribute to economic and social progress and the realization of decent work for all.

- The **contribution of business** to the realization of the Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work
- Inclusive, responsible and sustainable business practices
- The role of social dialogue and industrial relations
- Working conditions, employment promotion and training.

- The aim, approach, and principles of the ILO's MNE Declaration
- How to deal with the **challenges** that enterprises, governments, and employers' and workers' organizations face in achieving sustainable business practices

- Advise on policies, strategies and actions to maximize the positive contribution of MNEs to economic and social progress (foreign direct investment and global supply chains)
- Understand the different roles of governments, employers' and workers' organizations, and enterprises in promoting inclusive, responsible and sustainable business practices
- Gain insights into how to foster a public-private collaboration for the realization of decent work
